STATE OF ILLINOIS



Proclamation

WHEREAS, amateur radio has historically played a significant role in developing world wide radio communications; and,

WHEREAS, amateur radio provides excellent volunteer emergency communications for agencies including the National Weather Service, Illinois Emergency Management Agency, Illinois Department of Public Health, the American Red Cross, the Salvation Army, Central United States Earthquake Consortium, and others in times of natural disaster and other emergencies; and,

WHEREAS, Illinois has more than 20,000 amateur radio operators who repeatedly donate their time, equipment, and services to help their communities; and,

WHEREAS, by continuous learning and experimentation, amateur radio operators help to forward the science of electronics and radio-related communications; and,

WHEREAS, by example, teaching, and practical experience, including the opportunity to communicate with amateurs in space, amateur radio operators teach young people the opportunities available in radio and electronics; and,

WHEREAS, Illinois Radio Amateurs will continue to hone their communication skills by operating during the simulated emergency preparedness exercise known as "Field Day" on June 24-25, 2017;

THEREFORE, I, Bruce Rauner, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim the month of June 2017 as AMATEUR RADIO MONTH in Illinois and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.

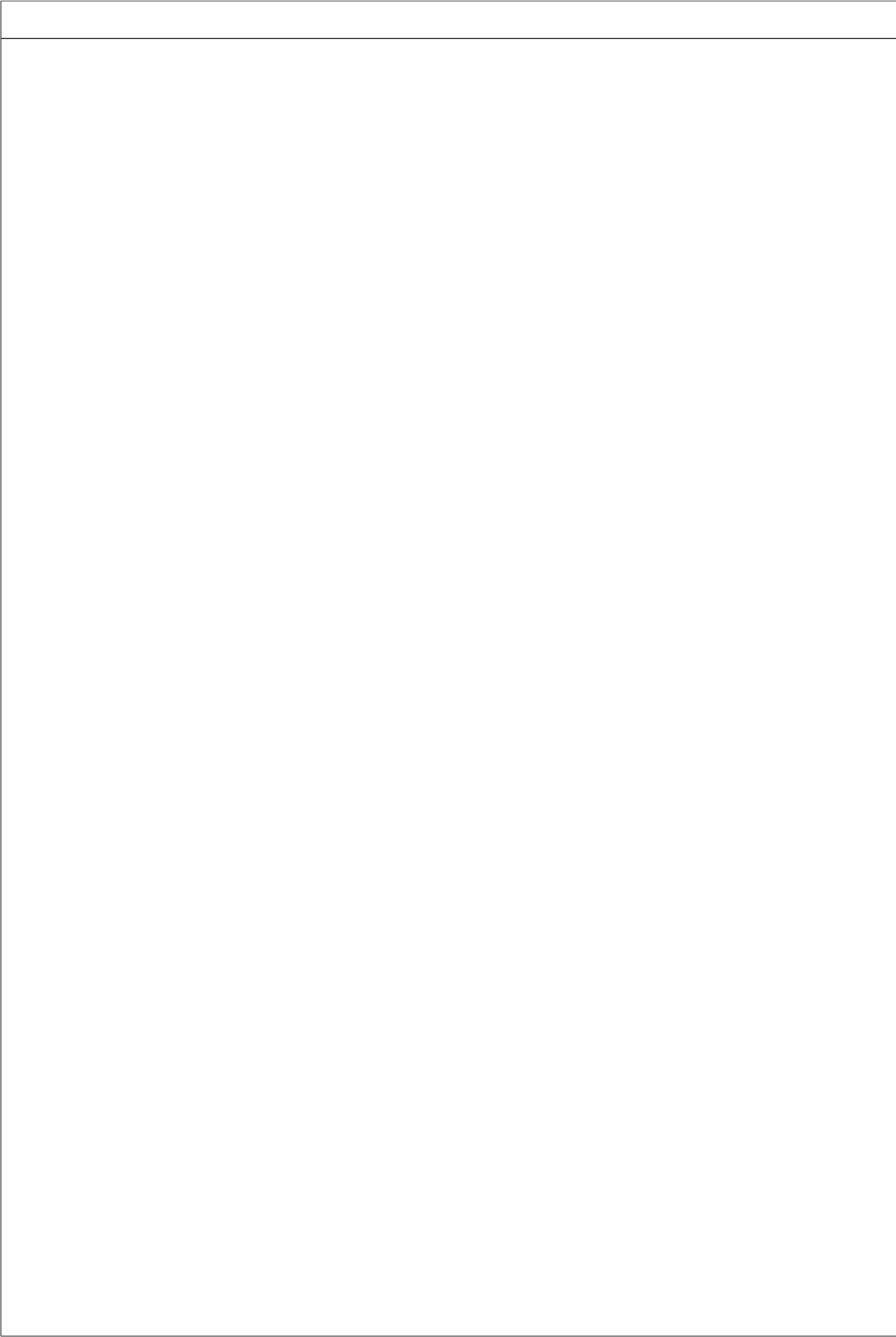

1. Recognitions:

CQ magazine announced the induction of Jerry Rosalius, WB9Z from Crescent City to the CQ DX Hall of Fame, which honors those DXers who not only excel in personal performance but who also "give back" to the hobby in outstanding ways. CQ DX Editor Bob Schenck, N2OO, presented Hall of Fame plaques at an induction ceremony held at the annual Dayton DX dinner on May 19.

Jerry Rosalius, WB9Z - an accomplished DXer and DXpeditioner, he has "worked them all" with the exception of North Korea, and participated in multiple major DXpeditions, including seven that were named as "DXpedition of the Year" by the Southwest Ohio DX Association. He is a frequent speaker at club meetings and hamfests and regularly makes his home station available for training new contesters.

The CQ DX Hall of Fame was established in 1967 to recognize those amateurs who have made major contributions to DXing and DXpeditioning. This year's inductions bring the total number of members of the CQ DX Hall of Fame to 71.
Six Meter Club of Chicago 2017 Walk For Autism

On Sunday, April 23, twenty members and friends of the Six Meter Club of Chicago, including several hams from the Bolingbrook ARS, DuPage ARC, and WCRA clubs, provided communications support for the Hinsdale Community House 10th Annual Walk For Autism. Communicators were stationed along the 3.1 mile route, using the club's K9ONA two meter repeater. Participants included KD9ATN, W9AVB and wife Lavonne, KA9ERS, WA9FIH, KB9FUR, WD9GDB, N9GFY, WD9GJK, N9HWV, KD9IDK, W9JGH, KB9KRT, AC9NP, KB9OYQ, KD4SLL, KC9TQF, KC9UTC, KC9VZH, and AK9Y. The weather was excellent, and more than 1100 walkers were registered for the event.

On Saturday, May 20, fourteen members and friends of the Six Meter Club of Chicago provided communications support for the 26th annual

La Grange Park *Run For The Roses*, a 5K run and walk which benefits a scholarship fund. Despite threatening weather about two hundred runners and walkers participated, with the race progress and leaders in the various categories reported by our volunteers to the race officials at the finish line. Since September of 2005 the Mississippi Valley DX and Contest Club (MVDXCC) has sponsored the W0 QSL Bureau as a service to the Amateur Community. The majority of the Bureau's sorters are MVDXCC members and part of each club meeting is devoted to matters of the Bureau. The following is a small part of the information you can get by going to the MVDXCC website and following the W0-QSL bureau link. "If you are a DX'er or Contester you probably use the ARRL Outgoing QSL Bureau system for the majority of your DX cards. As a member of the ARRL you can send bulk DX cards for a very reasonable price and receive DX cards from your local ARRL Incoming Bureau. To determine your Incoming Bureau you use the number in your callsign. If your callsign, for example, has the number zero then your Incoming Bureau is the Zero Bureau or Tenth District Bureau. For a listing of all the ARRL Incoming QSL Bureaus, click here. Incoming DX QSL cards arrive at your Bureau from DX Bureaus usually on a monthly basis. Each Incoming Bureau has its own procedures for purchasing supplies (envelopes, stamps & address labels) and getting cards to bureau subscribers." To learn more use the link <http://www.mvdxcc.org/>.
